

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


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CHECKING COOLANT LEVEL With coolant cold, check wheth

COOLANT

With coolant cold, check whether the coolant level is near the inlet port, and whether the level in the reserve tank is between the FULL and LOW marks. Add coolant if the level is low.



REPLACEMENT


- 1. Drain coolant out after opening the intermediate side housing plug.
- 2. Close and tighten the plug.
- 3. After pouring anti-freeze into the radiator according to the instruction below, add soft water.
- 4. Start the engine, bleed air from the coolant passages, and then add more coolant.

ANTI-FREEZE SOLUTION

Use recommended mixture of 50% ethylene glycol anti-freeze solution for aluminum engine and 50% clean soft water (demineralized water).

For proper system protection in regions where the temperature goes below -29°C (-20°F), add the necessary amount of ethylene glycol base coolant recommended by the coolant manufacturer.

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FAN BELT


INSPECTION AND ADJUSTMENT

- 1. Completely check all surfaces of the fan belt. Replace it if it is cracked or damaged.
- 2. Check the amount of deflection (at a point half-way between the alternator pulley and the eccentric shaft pulley) by applying a pressure of about 10 kg (22 lb).

Deflection:

- 1. $13 \sim 17 \text{ mm} (0.51 \sim 0.67 \text{ in})$
- 2. 11 \sim 13 mm (0.43 \sim 0.51 in)

FAN DRIVE

CHECKING FAN DRIVE

Check the following items and, if necessary, replace the part.

- 1. When the engine is cold, turn the cooling fan by hand and check to be sure that resistance is felt.
- 2. Check to be sure that there is no fluid leakage from the fan drive clutch.
- 3. Check to be sure that there is no deformation of the bimetal.
- 4. Check to be sure that there is no bearing play or grease leakage.

REPLACING FAN DRIVE CLUTCH

- 1. Remove the fan and fan drive assembly.
- 2. Remove the fan attaching bolts and separate the fan from the fan drive.
- 3. Assemble the fan and fan drive, and install them in the reverse order of removal.

THERMOSTAT

REMOVING THERMOSTAT

- 1. Drain the cooling system by disconnecting the radiator lower hose.
- 2. Remove the air cleaner (12A).
- 3. Disconnect the radiator upper hose.
- 4. Remove the thermostat cover.
- 5. Remove the gasket.
- 6. Lift out the thermostat.

CHECKING THERMOSTAT


- 1. Place the thermostat in water with a thermometer and heat the water gradually.
- 2. Check the temperature when the thermostat starts to open and when it opens fully. Also, measure the lift height when the thermostat is fully opened.







INSTALLING THERMOSTAT

1. Install the thermostat.

Note

Install the thermostat so that the jiggle pin is positioned on the upper side; if it is not, the valve-opening temperature will change.

- 2. Attach the thermostat cover,
- 3. Connect the radiator upper hose.
- 4. Install the air cleaner (12A engine).
- 5. Connect the radiator lower hose.
- 6. Fill the radiator with engine coolant.

RADIATOR CAP

CHECKING RADIATOR CAP

- 1. Attach the radiator cap to a tester. Apply pressure gradually, and then check to be sure that the pressure is uniform within the range of 75 \sim 105 kPa (11 \sim 15 lb/in²).
- 2. Wait about 10 seconds, and then check whether the pressure has decreased.

Replace the cap if the pressure doesn't reach 75 kPa (11 lb/in2), or if it exceeds 105 kPa (15 lb/in²).

RADIATOR

CHECKING RADIATOR

- 1. Examine the radiator carefully for leaks. If a leak is discovered, however small it may be, repair completely by soldering, or replace.
- 2. Clean the exterior of the radiator core by blowing with compressed air.
- 3. Check the pressure cap rubber gasket. Replace the pressure cap if the rubber gasket is damaged.

Cooling system pressure test

- 1. Remove the radiator cap. Add coolant if neces-
- 2. Install the radiator cap tester to the radiator.
- 3. Warm up the engine to the normal operating tem-
- 4. Stop the engine. Pump up the system to 100 kPa (14 lb/in²) and observe the gauge for about one minute. If the pressure drops, visually inspect all hoses and fittings for an external leak.

To remove the radiator pressure cap when the coolant temperature is high or boiling, place a cloth on the pressure cap and turn counter clockwise one step. Keep it in this position until all pressure is released. Then turn the cap further until it can be removed.

REMOVING RADIATOR


Remove or disconnect the following parts.

- 1. No. 2 water temperature switch connector
- 2. Coolant level sensor lead
- 3. Water hose for reservoir
- 4. Cooling fan and fan drive assembly
- 5. Radiator lower hose (drain the cooling system.)
- 6. Heater hose
- 7. Radiator upper hose
- 8. Oil hoses (for automatic transmission)
- 9. Radiator shroud
- 10. Radiator


INSTALLING RADIATOR

Follow the removal procedures in the reverse order. Fill the cooling system with a mixture of 50% clean soft water (demineralized water) and 50% anti-freeze solution (ethylene glycol base for aluminum engine).

WATER PUMP


CHECKING WATER PUMP

- Remove both the alternator belt and the air pump belt.
- 2. Remove the cooling fan.
- Check the water pump for cracks, abnormal bearing noise, coolant leaks, or any other visible damage.


If any of these conditions exists, the pump should be repaired or replaced.

- 4. Fit a dial indicator to the alternator bracket so that if contacts the water pump pulley as shown.
- Move the pulley up and down by hand.
 (Be careful not to turn the pulley, otherwise a false reading may be given.)
- If the indicator reading is in excess of the specified limit shown below, the pump should be repaired or replaced.

Water pump shaft play should not exceed: 0.5 mm (0.02 in)





REMOVING WATER PUMP


- 1. Remove the air cleaner (12A).
- 2. Disconnect the connector from the water temperature switch (12A) or water thermo sensor
- 3. Disengage the drive belt for air conditioning compressor and power steering pump (if equipped).
- 4. Remove the air pump and disengage the drive
- 5. Remove the alternator and disengage the drive
- 6. Remove the cooling fan and fan drive assembly.
- 7. Remove the pulley for air conditioning compressor.
- 8. Disconnect the radiator lower hose (drain the cooling system).
- 9. Disconnect the radiator upper hose.
- 10. Remove the water pump.





DISASSEMBLING WATER PUMP

- 1. Attach the adapter (49 1975 145) on to the pulley boss and tighten the four bolts firmly.
- 2. Support the water pump pulley adapter on the press. Press the water pump shaft slowly and remove the pulley boss.




3. Remove the snap ring.



4. Support the pump body and apply pressure to the rear end of the shaft to press the shaft bearing out through the front of the pump body.

5. Remove the impeller.






6. Remove the seal (complete) by lightly tapping with a suitable piece of pipe.

INSPECTING WATER PUMP

- Inspect the bearing for roughness or excessive end play. Remove any rust or scale from the bearing shaft with an emery cloth.
- Inspect the seat of the seal on the impeller for pit marks or scoring. If the seat of the seal is scored or pitted, the impeller should be replaced.
- 3. Inspect the water pump body and the impeller for cracks or wear. Replace if necessary.


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ASSEMBLING WATER PUMP


 Press in the seal (complete) by using a suitable piece of pipe.

Cautions


- a) When pressing in the water seal, be careful that the seal is straight, and that the surface doesn't become damaged.
- b) After pressing in the water seal, press the seal lip with a finger to be sure it moves smoothly.

- 2. Coat the water seal lip with coolant.
- 3. Press in the shaft bearing by using a suitable piece of pipe.

Caution

After pressing in the shaft and bearing, check to be sure rotation is smooth.


- 4. Attach the snap ring,
- 5. Press in the impeller.
- 6. Press in the puller boss.

INSTALLING WATER PUMP


- 1. Attach the gasket to the surface of the side housing which contacts the water pump.
- 2. Attach shims (for height adjustment) to the stud bolts indicated by 2 and 4 in the figure.
- 3. Install the water pump and tighten by evenly applying torque in the numbered order indicated in the figure.

Tightening torque: 18 \sim 27 N-m (13 \sim 20 ft-lb)

- 4. Connect the radiator upper hose.
- 5. Connect the radiator lower hose.
- 6. Install the pulley for the power steering pump and the air conditioning compressor (if so equipped).

- 7. Install the cooling fan and fan drive assembly.
- 8. Engage the alternator drive belt and install the alternator.
- 9. Engage the air pump drive belt and install the air pump.
- 10. Engage the drive belt for air conditioning compressor and power steering pump (if equipped).
- 11. Adjust the tension of each belt to 10 kg (22 lb.) when pressed at the places shown in the figure.

Standard belt deflection

Alternator drive belt	13 ~ 17 mm (0.51 ~ 0.67 in)
Air pump drive belt	11 ~ 13 mm (0.43 ~ 0.51 in)
Air conditioning compressor drive belt	10 ~ 12 mm (0.40 ~ 0.47 in)
Power steering drive belt	10 ~ 12 mm (0.40 ~ 0.47 in)

- 12. Connect the connector to the water temperature switch (12A) or water thermo sensor (13B).
- 13. Install the air cleaner (12A).
- 14. Fill the cooling system with the specified coolant.
